On Tuesday 17th of October, the consortium of the project Enfem - Female TCNs Integration in Local Communities through Employability and Entrepreneurship Local Oriented Strategies (101038287-ENFEM-AMIF-2020-AG) - met in presence for its last Transnational Meeting. It was held in Porto (Portugal) hosted by ISCAP, the Coordinator of the project.

The meeting started with an update on dissemination activities and the importance of sustainability actions to guarantee a proper impact to the project results.

Then, the Consortium analyzed the goals obtained within Work Packages 3 and 4 and the importance of making the final efforts to reach the required indicators.

Up to now, the partners have trained more than 200 local actors using the modules on Diversity Management developed by the Consortium, together with more than 300 international women who had the opportunity to acquire new skills for employability and entrepreneurship.

In addition, 270 women third country nationals participated in work-based learning activities organized by each partner. Every country has decided, according to its local contexts, which activities organized such as job fairs, study visits, and open days to strengthen women's possibility to be included in the labour market.

The project will end on the 30th of November, but the partners are already working to start new initiatives together again.

CEIPES is really glad for the results achieved and the impact of the project inside and outside its organization. Much progress can still be made for the inclusion of migrant women in the labor market, but we hope for other initiatives such as the ENFEM project.

Final Conference on the ENFEM Project

On the 18th of October ISCAP organized the final conference of the ENFEM project. Every partner took part in the event and it was a chance to discuss the main topics of the project.

The initiative started with a panel on "Needs, perceptions, challenges and expectations: the voice of migrant women and Local actors" discussing the research made by the Consortium on the situation of international women within the European labour market and the importance of intercultural mediation to guarantee their inclusion.

The second panel was about migration and intersectionality: the creation of overlapping and interdependent systems of discrimination or disadvantage that characterized groups such as migrant women.

The conference ended with a discussion on the education and empowerment of international women analyzing the representation of migration in the media in the Portuguese context and explaining the main results of the ENFEM project.

The debate was really fruitful, and the audience was enthusiastic and committed during all the speeches.
